Lou Anna K. Simon is the 20th president of Michigan State University, leading the way to Advancing Knowledge and Transforming Lives. She served as provost and vice president for academic affairs from 1993-2004, interim president in 2003 and was appointed president by the MSU Board of Trustees in January 2005.

Simon's commitment to the land-grant tradition of applying education in many areas, particularly in economic development and globalization, has been demonstrated on a national level through her work with her involvement as a member of the Council on Competitiveness and the Board of Directors for the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges (NASULGC).

Simon was appointed to the State of Michigan Governor's Emergency Financial Advisory Panel and she has served as a member of the Lt. Governor's Commission on Higher Education and Economic Growth. Furthermore, she is a member of the following global initiatives: the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on International Initiative and the Partnership to Cut Hunger in Africa Executive Committee.
